Miami Dolphins bring home the win at the Super Bowl LX

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. - The Miami Dolphins bring home a win for the first time since 1973.

On Sunday, Feb. 8 the Miami Dolphins faced the Tampa Buccaneers in the 2026 Super Bowl (Super Bowl LX) at the Levi Stadium in Santa Clara, California. Miami was down 31-30 with just two minutes left on the clock, as 120 million people watched the game live on television. With fans on the edge of their seats, quarterback Tua Tagalovaloa made a 38-yard toss to tight end Julius Thomas, who secured an astonishing one-hand catch for a touchdown.



Head Coach Brian Flores commented on the big win “ It’s the ultimate. This is what I came there to do. But it took nine months, nine months of incredible sacrifice, not only by these men right here but everyone in our organization, grinding it out every single day, ups and downs, highs and lows.”

The victory sparked a citywide celebration. The team will be holding a parade Wednesday, Feb.11, in downtown Miami to celebrate the long-awaited victory. Miami Dolphin players, the coaching staff, and the Dolphins cheerleading squad will all be present to celebrate with fans. Most players ride in double decker buses. Taglatovia and Gaskin are expected to ride on a fire truck and greeting the crowd. Tagalioa tweeted on Monday “ Come downtown and I’ll blow you a kiss.” Gaskin tweeted, “Miami parties better than any cities in the world.”

The parade will take place in Downtown Miami. The route will begin at Southwest Second Ave. and Southwest Eight St at approximately 11a.m. It will head east before turning north onto Brickell Ave. After crossing the Miami River the parade will continue its route along Biscayne Blvd., and end at the Kaseya Center in the afternoon.

The parade is free and expected to draw 400,00 Dolphin fans. Volunteers handing out bags of confetti for fans to toss. Miami Police spokeswoman Kenia Reyes said backpacks will be banned as precautionary measures to ensure the safety of everyone. Vendors will be set up along the streets selling food, bottles of water, Dolphin souvenirs, and official Superbowl LX T-shirts.

Streets in downtown Miami will close at 8:30 a.m. Wednesday and expected to reopen to traffic after 3 p.m. Attendees are encouraged to come early and park or take public transportation, as parking garages are expected to fill up early. The MetroMover has several stops along the route.
